Good News for Hard Heads, Part 3: Ever Increasing Glory

Exodus 34: Moses and the Veil

The brightness of his face indicates how long since Moses has heard from God

Problem: Sometimes we live with a “One and Done” or a Fading Spirituality.

2 Corinthians 3:12-13 Therefore, since we have such a hope, we are very bold. We are not like Moses, who would put a veil over his face to prevent the Israelites from seeing the end of what was passing away.

We have been invited to boldly pursue more of God.

Rather than mitigate fading revelations we can boldly pursue fresh ones.

- ♦ worship
- ♦ times and seasons of prayer
- ♦ consuming scripture
- ♦ digging into church teaching
- ♦ reading books

Hebrews 4:16 Let us then approach God’s throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

God tells us ahead of time how he will respond to our pursuit.

Are there are areas of your life or Spirituality where the Glow associated with God’s Presence might be fading?

Sometimes our problem is that we are waiting for God to just show up like a tornado and move us ...but he invites us to boldly pursue him.

God has something for you that is better than peaks and valleys.

2 Corinthians 3:17-18 Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And we all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord’s glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

Our faces are unveiled.

- ♦ This spirituality is not intended to be peaks and valleys.
- ♦ It is not intended to be a “one and done” thing that slowly fades.

The glory or the GLOW of God’s presence in your life can be such that it increases over time.

Key: With unveiled faces we contemplate.
